

European Commission Traineeships

(Blue Book Traineeship)

What is the traineeship?



5 months paid traineeship (Administrative/ Translation) European Commission or European Services/Agencies 2 sessions/year (1st March or 1st October) Approx. 1000 trainees/session



Eligibility Criteria



Completion of higher education: Full degree (min. 3 year on university level e.g. BA)



No prior experience in a EU Institution or body for more than six weeks or 42 days (incl. assistant to MEP)



Very good knowledge of at least 2 EU official languages: EN/ FR/ DE (CEFR – level C) + other EU language (min. CEFR level B2)



Eligibility Criteria





How to submit your application

- <u>ONLY</u> during application periods (usually January & Summer)
- ONLY online application form
- NO AMENDMENTS or CORRECTIONS
 after submission
- <u>ALL COMMUNICATION</u> with Traineeships Office via <u>personal stage online account</u> <u>or e-mail</u>

How does the new selection procedure work?

- The highest scored candidates (around 3 000 successful candidates) are included into the Virtual Blue 1. Book (VBB).
- 2. Trainees in the VBB can apply for up to 3 published traineeship positions
 - ► You have around 1 week for applying
 - You can mark as many positions as you like as favourites
 - The number of applications per position is limited, if the max. number of applicants is reached, the position will disappear
- 3. If none of your 3 applications is successful, you still have a chance to be selected by any other department whose posts have not yet been fulfilled during the second round of selection.

The final decision to recruit candidates falls exclusively under the responsibility of the DGs, services or agencies and shall only take effect when the Traineeships Office sends the placement offer!

Twice a year:

- Traineeships beginning in October: applications open in January of the same year.
- Traineeships beginning in **March**: **applications** open **July-August** of the previous year.

You must submit all supporting documents at the same time as the application form.
